What Does the Fund Invest In?

The investment objective of this Fund is to achieve long-term capital growth by investing primarily in a diversified portfolio of domestic and foreign equity securities, Canadian preferred share securities, and to a lesser extent, fixed income and money market instruments and/or cash equivalents through a sustainable investment approach. Such investments may be made by the Fund either directly or indirectly through investments in other mutual funds, including ETFs.

The charts below will give you a snapshot of the fund's investments on February 29, 2024. The fund's investments will change.

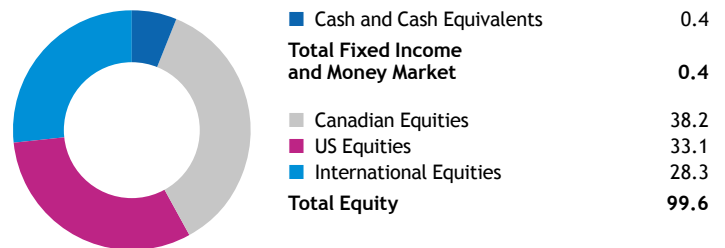

How Risky is It?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

Risk Rating

Addenda has rated the volatility of this fund as **low to medium**.

This rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low to medium risk rating can still lose money.

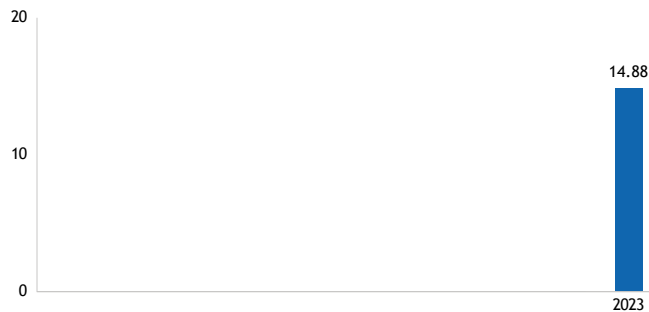
Like most mutual funds, this fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the money you invest.

How Has the Fund Performed?

This section tells you how Series F units of the fund have performed since inception. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund's returns.

Year-by-year Returns

This chart shows how the Series F of the fund performed in the last year. The series did not drop in value in the last year. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the fund will perform in the future.



Best and Worst 3-month Returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series F of the fund in a 3-month period over the past year. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

Average Return

The annual compounded return of Series F units of the fund was 4.91% since its inception. If you had invested \$1,000 in this series since inception, your investment would now be worth \$1,096.22.

Who is this Fund For?

- You want to invest in a fund that takes a sustainable investing approach;
- You are prepared to accept a low to medium risk;
- You are looking for a long-term investment;
- You are seeking long-term growth, through an investment diversified by asset class, style and geography.

A Word About Tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan (RRSP) or a Tax-Free Savings Account (TFSA).

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How Much Does it Cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series F units of the fund. The fees and expenses (including any commissions) can vary among series of the fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

Sales Charges

You pay your representative's firm an annual fee based on the asset value of your account instead of paying commissions or fees on each purchase.

Fund Expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns. As of December 31, 2023, the fund's expenses were 0.88% of its value. This equals \$8.80 for every \$1,000 invested.

More About the Trailing Commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the fund. It is for the services and/or advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

Addenda does not pay any trailing commission to your representative's firm with respect to Series F units.

Other Fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch securities of the fund through your representative.

Fees	What You Pay
Fee-based account fee	The Series F is only offered to investors who have entered into an agreement to pay fees directly to their representative's firm. These investors pay their representative's firm annual compensation based on the asset value of their account. You negotiate these fees with your representative.
Short-term trading fees	A fee of 2% of the value of the units you redeem or switch within 90 days of purchase may be charged by Addenda. This fee goes to the fund.
Large transaction fee	A fee of up to 0.5% of the value of the units you redeem or switch may be charged by Addenda if, within 30 days of redemption or switch request, the aggregate net asset value of the units you redeem or switch exceeds 10% of the net asset value of that series of units of the fund. This fee is paid to the fund.

What if I Change my Mind?

Under the securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual funds within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document; or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
