## Management Discussion of Fund Performance

---

### Investment Objective and Strategies

The Addenda Global Balanced Fund's (the "Fund") investment objective is to provide long-term capital growth and generate dividend and interest income by investing in domestic and foreign equity as well as fixed income securities through a sustainable investment approach. Such investments may be made by the Fund either directly or indirectly through investments in other mutual funds, including ETFs.

To achieve the Fund's investment objective, the Manager uses strategic asset allocation as the principal investment strategy. The Fund has a target weighting of 20-60% in Fixed Income and Money Market, and a target weighting of 40-80% in Equity.

In addition, when selecting the majority of securities in which the Fund invests, the Manager will integrate environmental, social and governance (ESG) matters along with active stewardship, which covers engagement with issuers and proxy voting.

### Risk

There were no significant changes to the investment objectives or strategies that affected the Fund's overall level of risk during the period. There were no changes to the Fund's risk rating during the reporting period. This Fund remains suitable for investors who are seeking a combination of current income and some long term growth and who have a low to medium tolerance for risk.

### Results of Operations

The Addenda Global Balanced Fund (Series A) returned 9.45% for the year ending December 31, 2025 while the benchmark index, composed of 30% FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index, 10% Bloomberg U.S. High Yield 2% Issuer Capped Index (C\$ hedged), 30% S&P/TSX Composite Index, 15% S&P 500 (CAD), and 15% MSCI EAFE Net (CAD), posted a 16.47% return. The Fund underperformed the benchmark primarily due to security selection within our equity strategies, which caused performance to lag versus their respective equity benchmarks. As well, a defensive asset mix shift in March hurt as markets rebounded strongly in Q2 after uncertainty declined surrounding tariff threats by the U.S. Administration in April. Asset allocation moved to an overweight in Canadian equities in July, which was a positive source of value in the second half of the year.

Unlike the benchmark, the Fund's performance is calculated after fees and expenses. Please refer to the "Past Performance" section for the returns by series, which may vary because of differences in management fees and expenses.

The fixed income allocation outperformed during the year driven mainly by credit. Credit spreads narrowed materially and there was a record amount of corporate issuance in 2025. The Fund was overweight Canadian corporate credit and was overweight the Ontario Power Generation issuer in the Infrastructure sector. Medium- and long-term rates were higher over the year, which detracted from overall performance as the fund was slightly long relative to the benchmark.

The U.S. Equity allocation underperformed during the year driven by security selection. Health Care, Financials and Information Technology (Adobe) were the largest detractors from relative performance. This was partially offset by a positive contribution from Communication Services (Alphabet), which had a very strong performance in 2025, closing the year +65% in local currency. Sector allocation had a very modest positive impact on performance overall.

The Climate Transition International Equity allocation underperformed its benchmark during the year driven by security selection. Holdings within Industrials (Data & Analytics) and Materials (Ingredients; Industrial gases) were the largest detractors from relative performance. Health Care positively contributed, with two of the top relative contributors in this sector. From a sector allocation perspective, the underweight in Financials had the largest impact, given its strong performance in 2025.

The Canadian Climate Transition equity allocation underperformed during the year. While value was added from the Communications sector (Quebecor Inc +70%) and by being underweight to the Utilities sector, this was more than offset by material negative contribution from stock selection in the Materials and Information Technology sectors. Agnico Eagle (+110%) and Franco-Nevada Corp were strong performers but lagged behind other Gold stocks. Not owning Celestica Inc (+206%) detracted as did owning several software companies, which were sold off due to the AI threat.

### Recent Developments

Labour market dynamics in Canada surprised investors by proving more resilient than anticipated, showing strong job creation in Q4. Together with wage growth running above 3%, the Bank of Canada ("BoC") was forced to acknowledge that policy rates were likely at or through the neutral level. The BoC and U.S. Federal Reserve ("Fed") both cut their respective policy rates by 25 bps at their October meetings, but the BoC elected a pause while the Fed instituted an additional 25 bps cut in December. Strong earnings reported during the quarter and accommodative policy from Central Banks helped to maintain the risk on tone and positively supported equity market returns.

The FTSE Canada Universe Bond Index delivered a 2.64% return in 2025 (CAD). Although interest rates fluctuated within a range throughout the year, they ultimately ended higher, creating a headwind for overall index performance. However, this was more than offset by a robust credit backdrop, as investors were drawn to the attractive all-in yields available in the market. Corporate credit performed particularly well, with the Universe Corporate BBB index returning 5.14%. Among sectors, Communications (+5.46%) and Real Estate (+5.33%) led the market, emerging as the top performing sectors for 2025.

The MSCI EAFE Index returned 25.1% in 2025 (CAD). This performance was driven by Financials (+45.6%), Utilities (+39.6%) and Industrials (+30.8%). It was mainly supported by banks and defense stocks, which reacted positively from interest rate cuts and geopolitical tensions. No sector had a negative return in 2025.

The S&P500 Index returned 12.4% in 2025 (CAD), driven by the performance in Communication Services (+27.3%), Information Technology (+18.2%) and Industrials (+13.8%). Alphabet was the main contributor in Communication Services and the IT sector remained driven by the AI theme.

The S&P/TSX Composite Index returned an impressive +31.7% total return in 2025, driven by a strong rally in the Materials sector, Gold & Precious Metals stocks specifically, and the Financials sector, with Banks posting strong returns.

## Related Party Transactions

Addenda Capital Inc. (“Addenda”) is the Manager and Portfolio Manager of the Fund. Addenda is controlled by Co-operators Financial Services Limited (“CFSL”), a wholly-owned subsidiary of Co-operators Group Limited. Addenda pays the “Operating Expenses” (defined below) of the Fund other than its “Fund Expenses” (defined below), in exchange for the Fund’s payment to the Manager of annual fixed-rate administration fees with respect to each series of the Fund.

The administration fees are equal to a percentage of the net asset value of each series of the Fund calculated and paid in the same manner as the Fund’s management fees. The Operating Expenses include, but are not limited to: audit and legal fees; transfer agency and recordkeeping costs; accounting and valuation fees; safekeeping and custodial costs; trustee services costs; and the costs of preparing and distributing financial reports, prospectuses, annual information forms, fund facts, continuous disclosure materials and other investors communication.

In addition to administration fees, the Fund shall also pay certain Fund Expenses, namely: taxes (including, without limitation, GST and PST or HST, capital taxes, income taxes and withholding taxes); bank charges, borrowing and interests; termination fees; regulatory filing fees; costs related to the Independent Review Committee (“IRC”); Operating Expenses incurred outside of the normal course of business of the Fund; costs of compliance with newly adopted securities regulations; and costs associated with portfolio transactions, brokerage fees and other trading expenses.

The Fund also pays annual management fees to Addenda as consideration for its services.

Addenda has established the IRC for the Fund in accordance with the requirements of *National Instrument 81-107-Independent Review Committee for Investment Funds* in order to review conflicts of interest as they relate to investment fund management. The Fund did not rely on an approval, positive recommendation or standing instruction from the Fund’s IRC with respect to any related party transactions in the period.

As at December 31, 2025, CFSL held 8,870,554 Fund securities for a value of \$101,786,834, which represented 95.00% of the net asset value of the Fund at that date.

As a result, the Fund may be subject to large investor risk as discussed in the Simplified Prospectus. Addenda manages this risk to reduce the possibility of any adverse effect on the Fund or on its investors, through such processes as requiring advance notice of large redemptions and large transaction fee.

(4) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio adviser manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of a fund.

## Management Fees

The Fund pays annual management fees to the Fund manager for its management services. The fees are calculated based on a percentage of the Fund's daily net asset value before applicable taxes and are paid on a monthly basis. A portion of the management fees paid by the Fund covers maximum annual trailer fees and sales commissions paid to brokers. The remainder of the management fees primarily covers investment management and general administration services. The breakdown of major services provided in consideration of the management fees, expressed as an approximate percentage of the management fees is as follows:

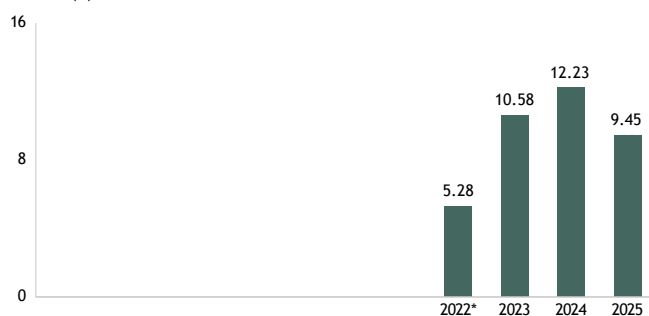
## Past Performance

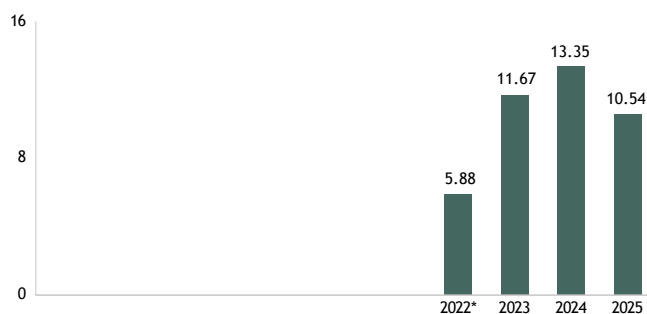

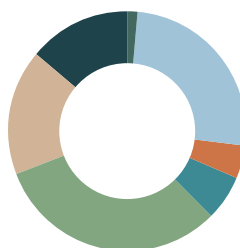
